Personalized Book Lists


3-5 years

Holocaust Survivor Speaker Presentation: Alice Goldstein

Wednesday May 11th 6:30pm-7:30pm this all ages program is open to grades 6 through adults. Patrons are encouraged to join us for the rare opportunity to hear a first person account of a survivor of Nazi Germany.

Alice Goldstein was born in a village in the Black Forest of Germany at the beginning of the Nazi era. She and her family experienced all of the devastations that led up to the Holocaust. Ms. Goldstein is a retired demographer/historian and Senior Researcher at Brown University's Population Studies and Training Center.
