



# Take & Make Sun Prints



Supplies Provided  
100% cotton fabric  
Acrylic paint  
Summer Template  
Foil

Supplies From Home  
Water  
Bowl for mixing paint  
Paint brush  
Scissors  
Baking sheet  
Sunshine

Soak your cotton thoroughly with water, then wring it out. You want it damp, but not pooling water. Once it's been wrung, spread it out on a foil-covered baking sheet.

Add a small amount of paint (about 1 tsp) to your bowl. Then add about 2 Tbsp of water and mix it together well. You want your paint to be very thin – just slightly thicker than water. Add more water if you need to.

Pour the paint onto the fabric and use your paintbrush to make sure that the paint covers the entire thing.

Once you have covered the fabric with paint, take your cardstock template and press it down on the fabric. You want the entire thing to be pressed down firmly – especially the edges. That's what gives you a crisp looking print.

Now, take your baking sheet and place it in the sun for 2-3 hours. You don't actually need a brilliantly sunny day for this, but if it's overcast, you will probably need to wait a few more hours.

Peel the cardstock from the fabric, and let dry

# Take & Make Sun Prints



Supplies Provided

Water  
Bowl for mixing paint

Sunshine

Now, take your baking sheet and place it in the sun for 2-3 hours. You don't actually need a brilliantly sunny day for this, but if it's overcast, you will probably need to wait a few more hours.
